RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF INFORMED CONSENT REGARDING VACCINES
AND OTHER MEDICAL INTERVENTIONS

WHEREAS, each individual has a unique genetic make-up which makes our health choices unique should be allowed to protect themselves and their children from substances that the individual deems harmful; and

WHEREAS, some communicable diseases such as polio, measles, small pox, etc. were nearly eradicated in the past, new diseases arise requiring intervention to stop the spread of the illness; and

WHEREAS, there are general agreements on the dangers of infectious diseases, there are differing solutions recommended by doctors and researchers to reduce the spread; and

WHEREAS, some vaccines contain materials that are morally unacceptable to citizens such as fetal baby cells, preservative ingredients, and other harmful components such as aluminum and human albumin that can cause serious negative reactions in patients; and

WHEREAS, vaccine makers are protected against lawsuits from negative reactions to their vaccines which makes those injured by the vaccine victims who will not be compensated for injuries sustained; and

WHEREAS, the recent outbreak of the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) has caused the government to take precautions to slow the spread of the disease, and although there is no vaccine at this time, there are several companies developing one; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i and other government entities have considered mandating vaccinations which obstructs a citizen's right to informed consent regarding substances proposed as a remedy; and

WHEREAS, when people are informed of side effects of a vaccine and choose to expose themselves to the vaccine, it would protect them from those individuals who choose not to take the vaccine.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hawai'i Republican Party in convention in Kapolei, Hawai'i on 16 May 2020, that the Hawai'i Republicans object to any mandate to vaccinate or ingest any compounds.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that until there neither doctors, parents, nor patients should be penalized for in any way for rejecting a medical intervention.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, be it further resolved, that copies of this resolution be posted on the Hawai'i Republican Party website, transmitted to the Governor of the State of Hawaii; members of the Hawaii State Legislature and the Mayors of all Hawaii Counties.
